SENIOR REFLECTION BY STEPHANIE VUYLSTEKE



My name is Stephanie Vuylsteke and I am a senior graduating from U of M.

Growing up, I lived in Ann Arbor and went to St. Mary Student Parish. My family got involved in different ministries here such as First Sunday (now Family Faith Formation), Families in Faith, Family Camp, and the Flint Family Service Trip,

which were all foundational in my faith life.

Along with participating in many things as a parishioner, I also saw university students living out their faith. I witnessed how passionate the students were about Alternative Spring Break and I was taught by student catechists for many years. When I chose to attend the University of Michigan, I knew that I wanted to keep attending St. Mary's as a college student. In this new phase of my life I was able to explore my personal faith as a young adult and get involved in different ways. I started going to the student mass on my own, and I was amazed by how many people I saw there that I didn't know were Catholic beforehand.

My freshman year I went to some social events, but I truly felt my place as a Family Faith catechist and an ASB participant. Teaching kids about Catholicism helped to further my own faith as well as give back to the next generation, like the older students did for me. After our time on Zoom it has been great to see the families being able to gather together again for FFF and the life that it brings into the church.

The other cornerstone of my faith life and time at St. Marys has been ASB. My freshman year ASB trip to Baltimore was life changing. I was pushed out of my comfort zone but learned so much and had meaningful conversations with my group. I attended an Alternative "Summer" Break to Detroit in 2021 and participated as a site leader to West Virginia in 2022.

During this past year as a St. Mary's intern, I have been able to take on a new role in the church. I helped oversee Family Faith Formation and Alternative Spring Break, and I was able to use all of my former experience in a new way. I am so grateful for St. Mary's and the journey that I have had, growing from a child just watching the college students, to an active participant in events, to a peer leader.




