BE BOLD: A WORKSHOP OF HISPANIC TEENAGERS

Many of us wonder what is happening with the youth, why it seems or seems that young people are increasingly moving away from the church, but few of us get down to the task of doing something about it, this is how this idea of the Be Bold retreat emerges as an alternative to the long-awaited response of many for the future of our young people, young people who live between two worlds, two cultures and two languages, young people who need to be heard and seen, young people full of ideas and dreams, without a doubt it has been the preparation of this workshop a challenge because it is always difficult to find people committed to the cause but God always has his plans and he gave us a team full of wonderful people.

During our day we had moments of uncertainty thinking about whether we would be able to have participants, moments of joy at seeing the happy faces of our participants, we also had moments of deep tears that helped us reflect on who we are, moments of play and fun, but without a doubt, it was the moments of faith where we were able to meet that God who loves us infinitely just as we are, which made this experience something magical.

Lastly, I would like to take this space to thank Rosa Luz for her tireless work for our community, each one of the team members Nayeli, Osvaldo, Laura, Agnes and Andrea for opening their hearts to this call, Omar my husband and faithful adventure partner and last and not least to all the young people who gave themselves the opportunity to live something different for the first time and some for the second time, thank you because thanks to you we are making a difference and to all those who still do not live this do not miss the experience next time, because in these times we need to be different, be brave, BEBOLD!




