Parish Insight



Dear St. Mary Student Parish Community,

I am honored and excited to be able to serve you as pastor! After Father Jim announced three months ago that I would be the new pastor, I have had many conversations with both resident and student parishioners of our parish, some of you who recently arrived in Ann Arbor and some of you who have been involved in our parish for decades, some of you who just started your college careers and some of you in your golden years. Since I arrived here last year, I have had the privilege to celebrate with you the joy of baptisms and weddings as well as to accompany you at anointings and funerals. Through it all, I have been moved by your deep faith, your passion for social justice, and your profound commitment to our St. Mary Student Parish community.

In his encyclical *Evangelii Gaudium* (#28), Pope Francis describes a parish as, “the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God’s word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration. In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers. It is a community of communities, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a center of constant missionary outreach.” These words reflect in many ways what we are already doing as a parish community and they summarize quite well what my hopes would be for our parish community as we move forward together in faith.

As I assume the role of pastor, I humbly ask for your prayers. While I had leadership roles in the past, this is my first time as pastor, and I recognize I still do not know what I do not know. Yet, I am confident that with God’s abundant grace and your support, we will continue to be a vibrant and welcoming parish, nourished by Our Lord in the Eucharist, and sent forth into the world to share the Good News in both word and deed. We are blessed to be a community of both resident and student parishioners, of young families and retirees. We are blessed to have community members who speak to God in Swahili and Tagalog, Arabic and Spanish, among many other languages. We are blessed to have ardent defenders of migrants and of the unborn.

While some might find the diversity of generations, viewpoints, and cultures in our parish daunting, I find in this diversity the richness of what it truly means to be Catholic. It is my earnest desire that our diversity will be a source of growth for all of us, no matter how long we have been at St. Mary. So, I hope to foster an intercultural spirit at St. Mary, a spirit of “both/and” as opposed to “either/or,” a spirit where we are open to be inspired and enriched in our faith by one another’s different perspectives and experiences. Throughout my life, I have seen myself as a bridge builder, across racial divides as a teenager in Hawai’i, across political divides as a young professional in DC, and across theological divides as a Jesuit scholastic.

Through an intercultural, bridge-building approach, we will be able to model the unity that Our Lord calls us to embody as His followers, and so draw others to walk with us on our faith journey. We will truly be, as Pope Francis says in his encyclical, “a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey.” My dear sisters and brothers in Christ, I look forward to walking with each and every one of you on this journey. God bless you!

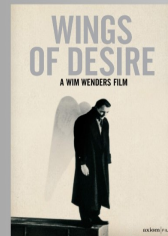

Molly Burhans is an award-winning Catholic environmentalist, cartographer, and social entrepreneur. She is the founder of GoodLands, an organization whose mission is to mobilize the Catholic Church to use its land holdings for environmental and humanitarian good. Burhans was the chief cartographer for the first unified global map of the Church, which premiered at the Vatican in 2016. She is one of Encyclopedia Britannica's 2022 "20 Under 40," a winner of the Sierra Club's EarthCare Award, a U.N. Young Champion of the Earth, a National Geographic Emerging Explorer, and an Ashoka Fellow. Molly is a visiting professor at Canisius College and adjunct professor of Urban Design at Columbia University Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation.

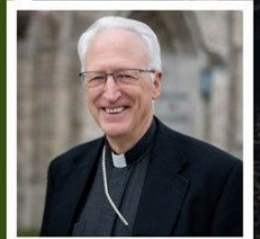

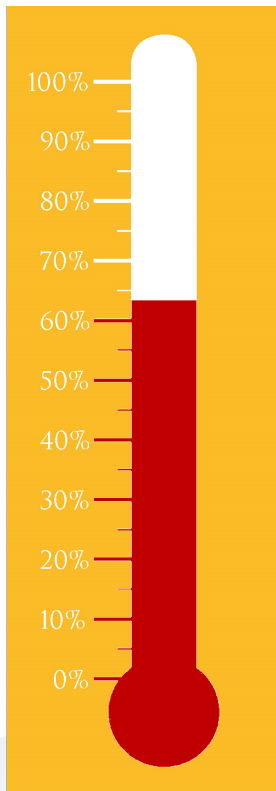

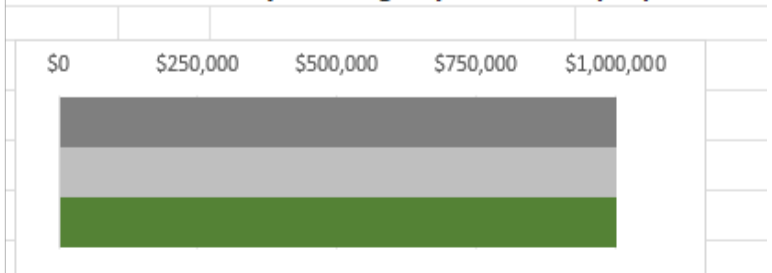
