Parish Insight

St Mary Student Parish Stewardship Overview from the Parish Finance Council

St. Mary Student Parish (SMSP) operates on a July 1 to June 30 fiscal year, so we are near the end of the 2022 budget cycle and finalizing our 2023-2024 budget. With several important changes happening at SMSP that have a major effect on our financial needs, the Parish Finance Council, the fiscal advisory body to the pastor, believes this is a good time to give you an overview of parish stewardship.

The good news is that the parish is in a solid financial position, and we can place the parish in an even stronger place in the years to come when we celebrate our 100 year anniversary in 2024. While we have no shortage of challenges, because our parishioners have always been farsighted and generous, we have a legacy that we can continue to build on.

Our budget reflects the uniqueness of SMSP as well as the important changes that are underway.

SMSP has been very fortunate to have five nearly full time priests. But by this fall we will have a reduction to 3 and a half priests.

While students are a central focus, the parish also serves a broader University community (faculty, staff, recent graduates and alumni), as well as resident parishioners from all walks of life and ethnic groups, and their children. It is an increasingly diverse group requiring differing programs to meet a wide variety of spiritual needs.

With the reduction of our priestly staff, a transition to Fr. Kyle as our new pastor, and the challenges of the covid years receding behind us, some reorganization of staff is occurring to (a) facilitate teamwork, (b) help the parish staff focus on the multiple needs of this broad community and (c) be cost effective. The parish budget is built around providing the finances to meet those needs while keeping expenses under control.

The Parish is committed to a balanced budget with a focus on four key factors: Revenues, Expenses, Reserves, and Funds/ Endowments.

The parish is experiencing the same challenges that all of us have. Expenses continue to climb, revenues need to increase to meet those expenses, reserves are called upon to cover unbudgeted costs and funds/endowments must be used in accordance with the instructions that came with those gifts.

We are projecting that budget to be about \$1,923,000 for 2023-24, which will be a decrease from the \$2,104,000 2022-23 budget.

Revenues come mainly from three sources: (1) Sunday collections, (2) donations to the Campus Ministry Annual Fund and (3) transfers from Funds/Endowments. Currently, Sunday collections

are about \$65,000 ahead of budget. Campus Ministry Annual Fund donations are almost \$40,000 below budget even though our March Match Madness was a success, raising \$33,000 over the \$100,000 goal.

What has been unique both this year and last is that the Parish received covid funding--\$300,000 this fiscal year. Had we not received this funding, we would be operating at a deficit.

There will be no more covid money for the 2023-2024 budget year. As a result, we project that we will need to raise at least \$75,000 in additional revenue over what we raised in 2022-23 to avoid a deficit for 2023-24.

Expenses are largely the result of staff salaries and benefits. These constitute almost two thirds of the entire budget. So, the reorganization of the staff to fit the new reality of fewer priests but a highly demanding and diverse array of needs was a forward looking decision. A new stewardship position has been included in the 2023-24 budget to address this additional revenue need with the expectation that the position should pay for itself several times over. If you can help us find the right candidate, please let us know!

Reserves consist of Cash on Hand for various needs such as capital expenses. The new chairs for the church will be initially paid for from this source, and there are always repairs and maintenance work that becomes necessary.

Funds/Endowments are the legacy left by the previous generations of our parishioners. Most of these are for specific purposes such as capital projects and student programs although some can be used more broadly. Typically, we are restricted to using the earnings on these funds, which total about \$5,000,000, as part of our budget. We are fortunate that the earnings have been running around \$250,000 per year, and through sound management of the funds, for the last 5 years annualized returns are about 7%.

We are now looking at opportunities for the second half of 2024 and beyond.

With the 100 year anniversary of the Parish in 2024, we are contemplating the first campaign for SMSP since the 75th Anniversary. That campaign produced the Newman Center and much of our Funds/Endowment. We are working with the Diocese to combine its anticipated campaign for Catholic Education with our campaign for our Student Parish, as our missions of education and evangelization coincide. In the meantime, we *need to increase Sunday contributions by more than the rate of inflation (i.e. greater than 6-8%*).


