Parish Insight

Dear St. Mary Student Parish Community,

As we prepare to welcome the Class of 2027 to the University of Michigan next weekend, I am happy to be able to share with you about some exciting changes we have made to our Campus Ministry programs at St. Mary. While previously, Campus Ministry was housed in a distinct department, we have sought to integrate Campus Ministry more fully into the life of the parish. As a result, all our staff will share in supporting our Campus Ministry efforts. For example, our new Faith Doing Justice Coordinator, Julia Novotny, will continue to support our ongoing advocacy and service while fostering a culture of service among students. Similarly, our Hispanic/Latino Ministry Coordinator, Rosa Luz Postigo, will support our outreach to Latino university students.

We have also brought on board two Campus Missionary Disciples, both recent graduates from the University of Michigan, who will dedicate the next 10 months to service and residency at our parish. Their mission will be to go out and invite students to St. Mary and foster a welcoming and enriching environment here at the parish. Our hope is that our new Campus Missionary Disciples program will embody the call of Pope Francis laid out in his encyclical Evangelii Gaudium (#120), where he describes how, "In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples," and how, "anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love."

In the same encyclical (#24), our Holy Father explains that, "missionary disciples...boldly take the initiative, go out to others, seek those who have fallen away, stand at the crossroads and welcome the outcast...[with] an endless desire to show mercy." He notes that they are, "involved by word and deed in people's daily lives," bridging distances by, "touching the suffering flesh of Christ in others." Furthermore, Pope Francis indicates that they are to be, "supportive, standing by people at every step of the way, no matter how difficult or lengthy this may prove to be." Finally, he emphasizes that missionary disciples, "bear fruits of new life, however imperfect or incomplete these may appear," and so are, "filled with joy," celebrating, "every small victory."

With that context, allow me to introduce you to our Campus Missionary Disciples for 2023-2024. Bailey Burke, a native of Grand Rapids, Michigan, who majored in Creative Writing and Literature and History, describes how her time spent at St. Mary was, "the highlight of my time [as an] undergraduate," and how, "this community is so special and so dear to my heart." She will serve as our primary staff resource for undergraduate faith formation, including retreats, small groups / Bible studies, Women's Group, literature, catechists, and Friday Faith Formation. She also will be providing support for our marketing and social media for resident and student parishioners.

Michael Regan, a native of Whitefish Bay, Wisconsin, who majored in Biology, describes how, "St. Mary's is a place that I love and want the best for," and how he views being a Campus Missionary Disciple as, "an opportunity to leave a really significant mark on a place that means so much to me." He will serve as our primary staff resource for undergraduate outreach and liturgy/ worship, including Ig.Nite, Men's Group, intramural sports, Mass coordination, praise & worship / adoration, and Friday Faith Formation. He also will be providing support to Julia for our Faith Doing Justice programs for residents and student parishioners.



PRECIOUS BLOOD

In consultation with our Parish Pastoral Council, we have decided to return to offering holy communion under both species, the body of Christ (consecrated host) and the blood of Christ (consecrated wine), beginning with the Masses on the weekend of August 26-27.

Many Jesuit parishes throughout the country and Diocese of Lansing parishes have been able to return to safely offering communion under both species in recent months. We are grateful for our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who have agreed to serve in this way.

Please be assured that if health indicators in Washtenaw County were to change significantly, we would adjust accordingly. Many parishioners have expressed enthusiasm about how by returning to communion under both species, we all have the opportunity to participate more fully in the Mass.

I understand how some of you may be hesitant to return to receiving the precious blood. Each person would be free to choose whether to receive from the chalice or not. We will initially have two people at each Mass distribute a modest amount of the blood of Christ until we have a sense of how many people would like to receive from the chalice at each Mass.

If we run out of the precious blood or if you choose not to receive, please know that one receives the fullness of the Eucharist (body and blood of Christ) by receiving the consecrated host. In addition, offering the precious blood provides those of our parishioners who are either gluten sensitive or gluten intolerant, to receive the fullness of the Eucharist by only receiving from the chalice.

ANNUAL MISSSION APPEAL

Our parish will host Fr. Vincent Sunday, from the Diocese of Fort Portal in Uganda, this weekend. His group, called Children Waiting Everywhere, helps children and families through education, employment and health facilities. By supporting our endeavors you will be bringing LIFE to many children. Cost for providing gutters and a 10,000 liter water tank for one school : \$3,000.

Fr.Vincent will speak at all masses this weekend, and envelopes will be available to support his ministry. You will also have an option to donate online:
