Parish Insight

Dear St. Mary Parishioners,

What an exciting past couple of weeks it has been with students returning to the Parish and a flurry of activities! There is something different in the air this year. Perhaps it is because I find myself more settled now into my third year as a priest. Perhaps it is attributed to reduced anxiety and fewer COVIDrelated restrictions. While these factors may play a part, I believe there is a renewed sense of student-driven initiative and agency within our beloved parish community!

Over the past two years, during gatherings with the Grad/YP group, I humorously referred to myself as a "Young Professional Priest." (Though I'm not entirely certain they found it as amusing as I did!) Now in addition to being a "Young Professional" priest, I am also a Graduate Student. This past week, I began the Masters of Social Work program at UofM. Go Blue! Consequently, I am reducing my commitment at the Parish to half-time over the next 16 months. I will continue with the standard Sacramental ministry rotation and will provide support to the Grad/YP and LGBT groups. I'm incredibly thankful to Julia Novotny for stepping up to lead the Faith Doing Justice ministry!

This past Sunday, the Grad/YP Team hosted a fantastic kick-off BBQ in the Parish parking lot and courtyard, drawing in over 84 graduate students and young adults! We are very excited for the year ahead with two gatherings each month. One Monday per month we will gather for the Grad/ YP Mass & Dinner and another Monday we will host Spiritual Directions, with a diverse lineup of speakers and activities.

I am honored to serve as the staff support person alongside an exceptional Grad/ YP Lead Team. Cecilia, Paul, Casey, Noah, and Kelly are not only deeply committed to their faith but also bring an abundance of joy, enthusiasm, and intelligence to our community.

Cecilia Spesia is a third-year Ph.D. student in Pharmaceutical Sciences, working to design antibodies for drug delivery to the brain. Cecilia is from Joliet, Illinois, and graduated from Villanova University where she was a member of the rowing team. Coming from a Catholic university, Cecilia was initially daunted by the overwhelmingly secular environment of Ann Arbor and spent her first year feeling isolated in her faith journey. Since joining the Grad/YP group at St. Mary's in her second year, Cecilia has felt increasingly inspired and emboldened to live out her faith and is passionate about bringing other young adults together to do the same.


A big thanks to these remarkable young Catholics for their service to our Parish and Church! I am deeply grateful to continue journeying with the entire SMSP community.
