SCC GROUPS FOR FALL; JOIN WITH A FRIEND!

Never underestimate the power of a small group. I've discovered this so often from leading and coordinating our groups here at St. Mary's. Good things tend to happen when people are talking about God.

One Michigan pastor describes the small group ministry this way: "Groups can help us develop a greater sense of Christian community in a disconnected age. They help us practice our calling to understand and love each other. As we share and listen to stories, we learn how others are attempting to intersect the common and the sacred life."

Here at St. Mary's, our SCC groups, or Small Church Communities, discuss the Sunday readings and reflections. But they also get a chance to think a little deeper about their faith, and what it means to them. Hopefully, some good questions arise: "How do I live as a child of God? Where do I see God in the things that can be a struggle? What does faith look like in my life? What might be holding me back from a deeper relationship with God?"

Sometimes, people just need a place where they can talk about faith in an increasingly secular world.

We hear it from many students – they often feel they don't have any other place where they feel comfortable doing this.

Their faith can feel compartmentalized – something they can practice in church, but not so easily out in the world.

Small Church Communities:

Our fall session begins soon. Groups will meet once a week for eight weeks to discuss the readings. (Note: Another eightweek session is held during Lent). Study packets with reflections, questions and prayers are provided.

Groups are offered at various times to fit most schedules. There are groups for everyone, including grad students and undergrads. (Note: students may also want to join one of our ongoing Men's or Women's Connect Groups.)

Dates: Groups begin meeting the week of September 24 th through November 13 th .

Registration: Sign-up beginning on Sept. 17 (look for the sign -up link in next week's bulletin)!








Reading I Ez 33:7-9
