Vocations and Black Catholic History Month

In the month of November, we recall the many holy women and men who have gone before us in the faith, both those who have been formally canonized by the Catholic

Church as saints and those whose faithful lives are known to God alone. These sisters and brothers in Christ inspire us in our own journey and their courage and conviction might even prompt us to consider a vocation to consecrated life, the diaconate, or the priesthood. Among these role models for us as Catholics are Servant of God Sister Thea Bowman and Venerable Augustus Tolton.

Since 1990, the Catholic Church in the United States has observed the month of November as Black Catholic History Month to celebrate the long history and proud heritage of Black Catholics. Last week, we celebrated National Vocation Awareness Week here at St. Mary with a Vocations Fair featuring representatives from six groups to promote and support those considering vocations as religious sisters, brothers, and priests. Sister Thea and Father Augustus embraced God's invitation to serve the Church in this way despite the immense challenges they faced.

Born in 1937, African American Sister Thea Bowman, F.S.P.A. navigated the challenges of racism, segregation, and the struggle for civil rights in her native Mississippi. She dedicated her life to spreading the joy of the Gospel, sharing her rich cultural heritage, and promoting racial reconciliation. She said, "We unite ourselves with Christ's redemptive work when we reconcile, when we make peace, when we share the good news that God is in our lives, when we reflect to our brothers and sisters God's healing, God's forgiveness, God's unconditional love."

Sister Thea called us to work in cross-racial solidarity in order to seek the common good. Best-selling author Heather McGhee describes the "solidarity dividend," we enjoy if we work across differences to eliminate the impacts of racism and embrace diversity. McGhee explains how, "our fates are linked; an injury to one is an injury to all." Similarly, Saint John Paul II said, "[Solidarity] is...a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say, to the good of all and of each individual because we are really responsible for all."

More than a century earlier, Father Augustus Tolton was born into slavery in 1854, then fled with his family to Illinois, a free state. He overcame great odds and institutional racism to become a priest. After being excluded from his parochial school, then rejected from every American seminary, he completed his studies in Rome and was ordained in 1886. He said, "It was said that I would be the only priest of my race in America and would not likely succeed," yet the parish to which he was assigned in Chicago grew from 30 to 600 parishioners in just two years.

Sister Thea Bowman and Father Augustus Tolton are two of six Black Americans, including Henriette DeLille, Julia Greeley, Mary Lange, and Pierre Toussaint, who are on the path to sainthood. Today, there are over 200 million Black Catholics in the world, with 3 million in the U.S., including some 400 religious sisters and 250 priests. Black Catholic history began in the earliest days of the Church, as noted in the Acts of the Apostles (8:26-40) with the conversion of the Ethiopian Eunuch by Philip the Deacon, which predates the conversion of Saint Paul.

This weekend, we honor the gifts of Black Catholics in our St. Mary community through our Black Catholic History Month Mass. <u>A Place at the Table</u>, by the Midwest Jesuit Province, explains how, "Jesuit apostolates participate in the mission of Jesus Christ, the Reconcilier, by recognizing the dignity of every person; by cultivating a culture of hospitality where others may encounter the Risen Lord; and by advancing God's efforts to gather all persons into a community of belonging." May this celebration be one more step in our journey of reconciliation.

HELP NEEDED!

Leukemia Patient Needs Temporary Housing near Ann Arbor While Undergoing Medical Care

(From now - mid February)

A Catholic couple from southwestern Michigan is in desperate need of temporary housing from roughly now/November 13th – mid February while the husband continues recovery from a bone marrow transplant, (received on Oct 30th).

The housing must be within 30 minutes of University of Michigan Hospital, so that the patient is close by for frequent medical care and possible complications. It does not need to be a fancy place – only clean and with a kitchen. It does need to be removed from others as the patient has no immune system to fight any sort of germs. With this in mind, an apartment, small house, or something like a "mother-in-law" suite would be ideal. They can pay some monthly rent, (though the lower the better as their plight with this aggressive leukemia has caused astronomical bills and forced both spouses out of work). This couple has been exhausting the housing search but have not been able to find something that is both affordable and meets their needs.

This is truly a gracious, kind, and gentle couple. They would be beyond grateful for any housing help.

"One cannot know the Lord without this habit of adoring, of adoring in silence. I believe, if I am not mistaken, this prayer of adoration is the prayer least known by us,


it is the one we do the least", as if it were a "waste of time before the Lord, before the mystery of Jesus Christ".

SUBMIT YOUR WORK TO TRANSCENDENCE


Artistic Expressions of Truth, Beauty, and Goodness


